Grace to you and...

Happy Easter! The Resurrection is the absolute foundation of our Christian faith. We follow Jesus. However, the earliest Christians were clear that the resurrection was the reason they were willing to risk life and limb to share the good news. Without the resurrection, the crucifixion of Jesus is just news. However good, however faithful, however Spirit-filled Jesus was, we would likely not know his name if he had just been arrested and crucified. Historically, Jesus was killed because he was a threat to the powers that be in Rome and Israel, but that is not why we celebrate Easter. The real meaning of Easter, and of Jesus' Cross only reveal themselves in the empty tomb. It is there that the surprising victory of God is truly accomplished and fully revealed. The resurrected Jesus is far more than a crucified prophet or teacher. The risen Jesus is the savior who, by his cross took our sin and put it to death, and in his life and resurrection, raised all of humanity beyond sin and death and into eternal life. This is not just news, that is **good news!**

I am so grateful for the Lent and Easter season we just completed. It already seems like an eon ago, but I cannot thank everyone who made our Lenten dramas possible enough. The Joy Sharing offering for April will benefit Curt's Café. Please read on to learn more about their mission.

Proven at-risk or formerly incarcerated young adults have few resources available to them. With little hope of securing employment, even for entry-level positions, many end up living on the streets and return to destructive habits. Cycling through the courts, 86% of those released are sent back through the system within 3 years. We all pay the price for such recidivism. For our sake and theirs, it makes sense to direct these young adults toward a secure and productive future.

At Curt's they provide that opportunity by teaching marketable skills to young adults and then assisting in securing employment. They teach culinary techniques but also provide instruction needed to fill in educational gaps, gain confidence, and become job-ready.

The student-trainees, aged 15 through 24, are living in at-risk situations, such as having contact with the judicial system, or are homeless, food insecure or have dropped out of school.

A portion of Curt's Café's mission reads "We promote education, respect, compassion and integrity, and embrace the philosophy of restorative justice in all we do."

These young adults are determined to build a positive future for themselves. For them, being able to get and hold a job will contribute immeasurably toward their success.

And you can contribute to that success by prayerfully considering your financial contribution to Curt's Café. And consider dining there! The food is delicious! Their closest location is 1766 2nd Street, Highland Park. Thank you!

Whether you use gift cards to do your shopping, to plan a special celebration, to give as the perfect gift or to support PADS, you can help spread the gospel around the world. Your purchase of gift cards is earning funds towards paying for Operation Christmas Child's 2024 shipping goal of \$2,500. Does buying gift cards really make a difference? Let me give you an example.

If you spend \$200 on groceries every month for a year at your store of choice (let's use Jewel as an example), it would be like you donated \$108 to OCC. That would be enough to ship 10 shoebox gifts to kids in need around the world and have them get to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ. All that happens without costing you a penny more than you would normally spend. This is because 4.5%* of every Jewel card purchased is donated to the shipping fund.

LATEST NEWS FROM PADS LAKE COUNTY:

- PADS is moving closer to agreements that will lead toward more effectively meeting clients' needs by having a fixed site. Please pray for success in each step toward approval of purchases needed for the future program using a combination of motels and transitioning into fixed sites which will meet the needs of clients in a much safer, more efficient and effective manner. Watch for details as more information becomes available.
- An updated list of current needs is being sent weekly to PADS leaders who are coordinating donations in their local churches. These needs include lunch and dinner items and baby food previously listed as well as gift cards and other non-food items. PADS clients and staff are extremely appreciative of all the donations received. Items always needed include microwavable lunch and dinner meals, Walmart gift cards, gas cards, and fast-food cards.

<u>UPC PADS UPDATE</u>: UPC PADS will continue collecting and delivering healthy shelf-stable and microwavable food items year-round.

- A list of currently needed food items
 Is being shared weekly in the Tuesday Newsday email for everyone who wishes to donate at UPC. Our PADS shoppers, Cinda Bartz, Rick Burg, Rose Pech, Laura Tussing, and Mary Zorc also receive the list and use Walmart gift cards and other PADS donations for purchases which they deliver to First Presbyterian Church in Libertyville, which is the food hub for weekly church donations, or to the PADS office if needed there. PADS leaders at the churches receive the list from Dave Marsden who coordinates the First Presbyterian PADS collection, storage, and delivery to the motels.
- UPC Shopper gift cards purchased for a PADS donation allow you to give twice, locally and internationally, without any extra cost to you. A small percentage from each purchase goes into our Operation Christmas Child fund (OCC), helping to pay for shipping the OCC boxes to children overseas, while the entire amount of the gift card helps PADS clients—AND you don't have to go shopping! All this, by just purchasing the UPC Shopper cards for Walmart to donate for UPC PADS or cards for gas stations or fast-food places for PADS Lake County. Please indicate where you want the cards to be donated: UPC PADS or PADS Lake County. Rick Burg coordinates the use of UPC PADS Walmart cards and Rose Pech delivers the cards to PADS Lake County.
