### A Word for the Day...

In her daily devotional, A Word for the Day, the Rev. Cameron Trimble wrote the following: Native and South American tribes teach their young ones that when they are born, they carry within them a "Sacred knowledge bundle." This bundle holds all that they are (essence), all they can be (potential), and all their ways of knowing, being and doing (wisdom). All people have sacred knowledge bundles. So do all other beings. Trees have them. Animals have them. Every being, created by the Sacred Spirit, carries within it unique gifts needed in the world.

The understanding is that those with Sacred knowledge bundles are responsible for sharing their gifts with the community. We in our Western culture struggle to understand this. *We tend to see the world through the lens of individual ownership. We say things like "I am in possession of this knowledge," or "I have gained this understanding…" treating wisdom as an individual pursuit for individual enlightenment.* 

Thankfully, indigenous teachers stress that we are all part of a kinship system with all other beings. Our lives are in service to the community, not the individual. In this way, they also remind us that a healthy worldview is not anthropomorphic. Humans are not the most important characters in the story of creation... All of creation serves itself in balance, and all beings serve one another in relationship.

The Apostle Paul hints at this in 1 Corinthians 12:4-7 when he explains the role of the Holy Spirit. He writes to the church in Corinth, "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."

To each is given a unique *sacred knowledge bundle*. They all come from the same Sacred Source (Holy Spirit), but they are as varied as the ones who hold them. These are given to each of us for the common good.

Rather than just asking people to introduce themselves by their names and where they are from, consider asking, "What gift do you bring to us? What gift can you offer into this space?"

What is in your Sacred knowledge bundle? What unique gifts has God seeded within you for the betterment of the whole world? What a marvelous thing to ponder..!

# **MISSION HIGHLIGHTS**

### AUGUST JOY SHARING FOR PADS:

The month of August each year gives everyone a special opportunity to give financial support for our UPC PADS Site & PADS Lake County with a Joy Sharing gift. These gifts help provide a safe, warm, and welcoming site where people who are experiencing homelessness in Lake County can come to receive food, shelter, and other necessities.

PADS has been providing shelter to its clients throughout the pandemic with one site a night open last season as most of its clients continued to be housed in hotels. During the 2022-2023 Season PADS hopes to have two sites open each night and have only families and severely health-compromised guests in hotels.

Thanks to your ongoing donations, UPC PADS has helped to save many lives as it's continued offering this ministry since 1991. Most recently, we've done this by providing food, clothing, & other necessities along with gift cards & other financial donations. Last season we also had 40 volunteers helping onsite at the St. Mary of Vernon PADS Site, providing the dinner meal once a month, and donating needed clothing for guests.

Each PADS site is self-supporting and relies completely on donations received from its host church, other churches, community groups & individuals. All site workers are volunteers, so 100% of these donations are used directly to help the guests.

To help prevent some clients from becoming homeless, PADS has a Prevention and Diversion Program which is designed to help people before they lose their housing, to keep them in a safe environment and prevent them from living on the street. More will be shared about this program in worship during Joy Sharing time on August 21.

Donations can be made with checks payable to UPC and PADS Joy Sharing written in the memo or by a cash donation with Joy Sharing for PADS written on the envelope.

**UPC PADS SITE: Learn more about how you can help improve and save lives** by enabling UPC to provide safe shelter and delicious food, please **contact Rose Pech**. **(Info below.)** Our current plan is to have training on the last Thursday evening of September and to open the site on the first Thursday of October. Volunteers are needed onsite and offsite with a variety of tasks and time commitments. **Onsite volunteers serve once a month if possible-7 times total; some do less and some more. Substitutes are also needed.**
