CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NEWS

Dear Church Family,

How can it be August already? The summer has really gone by quickly. But, with the end of summer, comes the beginning of our ministry year. So, I want to tell you about the first study we will be having in our Adult Education classes.

Each year, we run a stewardship campaign. The purpose of this campaign is not just to gain insight into our potential giving for the next year so that we can set our budget, but it is also to highlight opportunities for you so that you can find a place to use your time, talents, and treasure for the building up of the church. In conjunction with this campaign, our first Adult Education class will be Discovering Your S.H.A.P.E. This is an acronym that stands for Spiritual Gifts, Heart, Abilities, Personality, and Experiences. It was developed out of *The Purpose Driven Life* by Rick Warren so that they could mobilize their members for service both inside and outside the church.

The purpose of our class is to help you find and explore the ways God has created you to do Kingdom work. Our first week will be introducing the class, then each subsequent week will be spent exploring each of the letters of the acronym. Between the weeks, there will be some homework, which we will then discuss in class. We hope that through this class we will find ways that we can continue to do God's Kingdom work in the world around us, both the church and in our everyday lives. God has called us all to do Kingdom work, so as we seek to live faithful lives, we desire to know and grow in the Kingdom work He has for us.

Finally, I hope that you will all put our Back-to-School Sunday on your calendars! This will be held on Sunday, August 25th in conjunction with our outdoor service (weather permitting), picnic, and ice cream social. We will have a blessing of the backpacks, so we encourage you to drop off new or lightly used backpacks as well as school supplies so that we can be a blessing to children in our community. Also, this is a wonderful opportunity to invite families you might know for a unique and enjoyable Sunday morning with ice cream. There will also be ministry tables set up so that you can register for our upcoming Ministry year. All our educational ministries will have registration sheets available and our Missions committee will be available to answer any questions about service opportunities.

On the family front, the kids had the opportunity to stay with Emily's parents for a couple weeks while Emily was taking a class in Minnesota. While there, the kids had a goal of swimming in the pool two times each day. Just a few days into their visit, they were unable to swim because of the weather. This initially was alarming, but soon William remembered that they swam more than twice on one of the days, so that counted toward the average. The crisis was averted, at least for now.

STEWARDSHIP NEWS

Dear UPC Members and Friends,

Sharing our time and talents is just as important as sharing our treasure; therefore, we on the Stewardship Committee encourage you to think about your hobbies and interests and find ways to share your knowledge and experience with others who can benefit from them. In that regard, if you have any interest in teaching, assisting with education classes or simply helping and spending time with children or youth, please consider getting involved in our children's Sunday School program or our Confirmation and youth programs. We can always use more help in these areas with either teaching weekly classes using a scripted curriculum or assisting the lead teacher for that week with prepared activities for the kids. With multiple volunteers either teaching or assisting, your time commitment would be minimal, possibly an hour or two once a month.

The Confirmation class, led by Pastor Jason on a weekly basis, is in need of assistants and mentors. Due to our safety policy, it is imperative that we have two adults physically present in the classroom each week for both children and youth. This safeguards our students as well as the teaching staff.

The children's Sunday School program meets every Sunday morning at 9 a.m. and ends approximately at 9:50 a.m. before the worship service begins. The Confirmation class has been meeting weekly on Wednesday evenings beginning at 6 p.m., or occasionally on Sunday afternoons depending on participants' schedules.

If you think you would be interested in trying to help in any of these areas, please contact Ryan Aubrey, our Director of Christian Education, and he will provide you with the proper paperwork to complete a background check. All of our adult volunteers who work with children or youth are required per our safety policy to have this done. Parents are comforted to know that our church is a safe place for their children.

In addition to serving as potential teachers, assistants and mentors, we also offer opportunities to serve on the various education teams, such as Adult Education, Children's Ministry, Confirmation and Youth Ministry. We welcome any and all who have ideas to share on how we can improve our Christian education programs and discover ways to reach out to those who need and wish to hear about the Good News and the Gospel of Christ. In our world and culture today, this is more important than ever.
