This is the path of faithfulness and faithful living. The second path exhibited in verses 13 – 15 leads to death. This is the result of our unfaithfulness, responding to circumstances by sin.

What are your prayers for this coming year? How would you pray for yourself, your family, your community, and your church? I encourage you to seek God and set some prayer focuses for the coming year. It has been a wonderful blessing for myself over the past year to see how God has answered my continuing prayers.

I hope that you all enjoy the rest of this Advent Season, Christmas, and New Year. I look forward to our upcoming discipleship opportunities.

<u>MANAGER</u>: Julie jumped in with both feet and got off to a great start as the new Shelter Operations Manager for PADS Lake County and our new supervisor for the PADS Emergency Shelter Site Leadership Team members. WELCOME, JULIE! Your enthusiasm and great job with communications are great assets to PADS and to the emergency sites.

HOTEL ROOMS HOUSE APPROXIMATELY 222 CLIENTS WHILE CHURCH SITES
HOUSE APPROXIMATELY 22 EACH NIGHT: As of the November PADS Lake County Site Leadership meeting, more than 40 of the 222 clients housed in hotels had valid housing vouchers but were not able to find a place to rent because of the unavailability of rental units and the number of landlords who refuse to accept housing vouchers. Hopefully, this situation will improve soon! Only guests who go to the PADS Lake County office between the hours of 8a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday through Friday and are transported to the church shelter site by PADS and guests who are dropped off by the police after the site opens will be allowed in the site.
