STEWARDSHIP TESTIMONIAL Presented by Barb Fischel on December 3rd

Giving an animal gift at the holidays is like giving someone in an under-developed part of the world a small business, providing wool, milk, eggs, and more. Brochures and order forms will be available after the worship service on December 17.

Post-Christmas clearance sales are a great time to start shopping for 2024's Operation Christmas Child shoebox filler items. This is often a great time to find toys and stuffed animals on sale, as well as hats and scarves.

When taking down your Christmas lights, remember to bring any unwanted or non-working strands to UPC to donate to the Lion's Club.

Christmas cards are useful to two of UPC's missions. Buy greatly discounted boxes of new cards or clear out your leftovers to donate to Companions Journeying Together. (These cards must not have multiple layers, glitter, take glued items, stickers, or added decorations.) Operation Christmas Child can reuse any style Christmas card you received from family and friends to send a cheery note to the recipient.

<u>THE BIG PICTURE</u>: <u>380+</u> PADS clients are now staying in <u>6</u> Lake County motels. <u>More than 80</u> of these clients rely on PADS donations in general and on the food and other needed items being dropped off by churches as the source of their daily meals and other necessities. <u>New or like-new winter hats</u>, scarves, and gloves are needed. Contact Rose Pech to make arrangements for donating these items.

<u>FOOD DELIVERY</u>: At PADS request, some churches which used to serve as emergency shelter sites have shifted to collecting and delivering shelf-stable microwavable food items to First Presbyterian Church in Libertyville where it is stored until needed at the motels. This system is proving to be more effective, efficient, and environmentally sound than having the sack deliveries of the 3-to-7-day food supply which were described in the October PADS UNIFIER article. Some churches also prepare and deliver dinners directly to the motels for the 80+ clients on Mondays and Thursdays. PADS hopes to get dinner meals delivered on the other nights, especially on weekends. In the meantime, the guests who need dinners on those evenings are being given donated food to microwave or gift cards to buy their meal. Most of the clients have jobs and/or have Link cards so they can pay for food and many of their other needs even though they don't have enough money for housing and/or can't find a place to rent.

UPC COLLECTION OF SHELF-STABLE, MICROWAVABLE FOOD FOR PADS:

UPC has started collecting healthy shelf-stable and microwavable food items and plans to continue doing so year-round. <u>Everyone can be involved in help-</u> ing those without a home! Choose one or more of the following ways:

- <u>Donate</u> shelf-safe nonperishable, microwavable food and other nonperishable food items for PADS clients. <u>Use the list found elsewhere in this UNIFIER</u> or take a list from behind the label in the plastic sleeve on the PADS container <u>under the Mission Counter</u> in the Narthex. <u>One idea:</u> BRING a food item each time you come to UPC. Put items from the list or comparable items into the PADS container under the Mission counter.
- <u>Assist</u> in packing food into boxes at UPC. (Volunteer by giving your name and contact information to Rick Burg or Rose Pech personally, or email pads_at_upc@hotmail.com. Volunteers will be notified of dates and can sign up for the packing dates on which they're available.)
- <u>Deliver</u> boxes of food to the First Presbyterian Church in Libertyville on designated day and time. See directions for volunteering in #2 above. (PADS staff will deliver food stored at that church to the clients at different hotel locations as needed.) THANK YOU FOR YOUR ONGOING SUPPORT!
