Grace to you and Peace from God our Father and from Jesus Christ, AMEN.

I pray that your Advent is full and blessed. This is a busy time of year for everyone, and this year it is particularly busy for our congregation. The Advent and Christmas season are favorites because of the beautiful stories that we know so well. The gospels tell us a lot about the signs that are sent to let people like Zechariah, Mary, and the Three Wisemen know what God is up to. The Shepherds are told "This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." (Luke 2:12)

Are you watching for signs for yourself? Last month at the Administrative Council meeting, we were looking at proposals for a new cleaning service. The vendors we had spoken with had quoted us a price beyond our budget, and at the exact moment that we arrived at that budget line item, an email was received notifying members of the committee that a counter proposal had been received that fit into our budget. It felt like a small miracle, and now we are blessed with the efforts of the professional cleaning service caring for our building.

The last two months we have seen participation numbers go up in worship. Last Friday, we had a tremendous turn-out for our St. Nicholas Event. We have also seen a sustained uptick in visitors in worship.

On Sunday, December 8, our Moderator shared an update on the projected budget shortfall for the 2025 budget year. One of the things that is so scary about money, it doesn't negotiate. Money demands that you pay for what something costs. If you are short of the money needed, the choices are to find more money or lower the cost. There are a number of efforts being undertaken to cover the projected shortfall by bringing in more income for 2025. However, I want our congregation to see that despite UPC's current financial challenges, there are far more signs that The Spirit is indeed active and moving this congregation forward towards a healthy and faithful future.

In fact, this coming June, we will be celebrating our 75th anniversary. This congregation has stayed together even longer than that, if you include that the Methodist and Congregationalist communities have existed since the mid-to-late 1800's. Our motto for the year will be "75+ years of keeping faith." This is itself a sign of God's faithfulness to this congregation.

There is indeed a lot to do and consider during the coming weeks, months, and the new year. Our primary calling is to follow the signs and gather together around God; whether we find ourselves at a manger, below the cross, or washing, feeding and forgiving each other. My prayer for this season is that we might attend to the many signs of where God is and where God is leading us. In attending to and following the signs God gives us, we remain a congregation open to God's guidance for us.

STEWARDSHIP NEWS

Dear Friends,

I would like to start by PRAISING GOD for the members and friends of the United Protestant Church. We are a faithful, compassionate, and HOPE-filled community of God's, devoted to serving Him here in Grayslake with our time, talent, and treasures to the best of our abilities. Next year is our 75th anniversary as a church family, and I pray that in 150 years the UPC is celebrating a new anniversary.

However, I do need to mention the elephant in the room. I refer to the 2025 budget. To maintain our current level of operations involving paid staff, current programs and building maintenance, we need ~\$73,000 more to offer a balanced budget at the 2025 Annual Meeting in late January than has been pledged and estimated based on past years' giving.

As Christians, we know that God is faithful. We also know that He calls us to be faithful in serving Him with our time, talents, and treasures.

The UPC leaders of Administrative Council, Staff Parish Relations and Stewardship want you to understand that your generosity is a blessing to God, our church, and our community. Furthermore, we want you to know that we have been in tight spots before and with God's guidance we have prevailed. However, to be good stewards, we need to oversee both our OPERATING BUDGET, funded by pledges, contributions and rent, and our SAVINGS (also called ENDOWMENT FUND) financed by monetary gifts from deceased members who gave the UPC proceeds from their estates. The Operating Budget pays our day-to-day bills. The Endowment Fund is our savings and emergency account.

If we continue to spend beyond our Operating Budget, we will deplete our savings and no longer have an emergency fund. Therefore, to date, the following moves are possible:

- There will be reductions in staff salaries.
- All committees and commissions of the UPC, including those dealing with building expenses, will be urged to pare down already prudent budgets.
- We are looking into the possibility of renting space to a small congregation to help defray costs.
- With his permission, we will be talking to other churches without a pastor to offer Pastor Jason's services as a ¼ time pastor to potentially provide weekly sermons and funeral services.
- With the addition of new AV and streaming systems, we anticipate broadening our online presence
 and adding online members. We further anticipate this effort will also increase the technical quality
 of our in-house worship, adding to the likelihood we will continue to grow our membership under
 Pastor Jason's leadership. As we grow in numbers we will also grow financially.
 - As an aside, the fundraising done for the AV replacement was distinctly separate from the regular stewardship appeal and budget analysis.

With God and one another, I believe we will prevail against any adversity. If you have questions, please feel free to stop me in church or email me at Rasmuss4@aol.com.

United Protestant Church of Grayslake: Keeping Faith for 75+ Years!

In 2025, the United Protestant Church of Grayslake celebrates seventy-five years of Keeping Faith in the heart of Grayslake. In the next few months we'll be marking our anniversary by sharing some history here in the Unifier, in special emails, displays and events at church. The anniversary will culminate in June 2025 and as soon as we have a date confirmed with our UCC and UMC guests, we will publicize the date of the anniversary worship service celebration.

We're naming our celebration 75 years "+" because UPC has a history that predates its founding in 1950, and because we know UPC will have a future that lasts beyond the past seventy-five years.

UPC's prior history began in the 19th century, in the histories of three prior congregations: the Gages Lake Methodist Church founded in 1877, the First Congregational Church of Grayslake founded in 1891, and the Grayslake Methodist Church founded in 1901. In 1922, the Gages Lake and Grayslake Methodist Churches merged and used the building of the Grayslake Methodist Church, at the intersection of Whitney Street and Park Avenue, where a white clapboard church and parsonage stood. The former Congregational church stood at Lake and Center Streets and is used by the Masonic Temple today.

In 1949 when the pulpit of the Congregational Church was empty, the Grayslake Methodist Church extended an invitation to the Congregational Church to begin worshipping together, and on June 20, 1950 each congregation held a meeting to approve the merger of the two congregations into one. In 1954, ground was broken for the sanctuary our church uses today, and in 1958 construction began on the education wing.

The United Protestant Church was ahead of its time in merging members of two historic American denominations and moving across theological differences toward unity of worship and spirit. Later in the decade, the Congregational Christian Churches and the Evangelical and Reformed Churches would merge to form the United Church of Christ in 1957. A decade later, the United Methodist Church was born from the merger of the Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethern Churches. These denominational mergers brough together heritage from the English, Prussian, German, Swiss, and French Reformations. The United Protestant Church now includes and welcomes those of many more Christian backgrounds, as we continue our faithfulness toward unity of worship and spirit.

As we celebrate UPC's 75+ years in 2025, we'll be sharing church history, inviting you to church events, and looking forward to a celebration in June 2025 as we give thanks for those who gathered on June 20, 1950 to enact a vision of unity which endures today.
