Grace to you and Peace!

This month I want to take a moment to speak with UPC about pastoral visits. One of the great joys and privileges with which ordained ministers are blessed, are pastoral visits. There is no higher priority for me than to be present to these invitations. It is my desire to pray with you in the hospital before or visit after a procedure, to join you to prayerfully listen to your challenges and hurts, or to shepherd your family through the final weeks, days or even minutes of our earthly journey with God. Permit me to share my thoughts on the best practices and policies for visits and calls.

"If I know I go."

These words of wisdom were given to me by my first senior pastor; and they remain to this day my rule of thumb for pastoral visits. There are two pieces in this phrase I want to highlight with you all. First, I want everyone to hear the high importance I place on being present to your pastoral needs. It truly is an amazing privilege. Secondly, I want to stress that I need your help to make this happen. I can only be present if I am notified and invited in a timely fashion.

While those are my two key stresses, permit me to take this opportunity to share a few other thoughts on best practices. First, it is always best if a request is made directly by the person desiring a visit or a member of their immediate family, as opposed to by another church member or friend. Notifying us on behalf of someone else without their expressed need is not welcome.

When possible, the best and preferred method of notification of pastoral needs is an email to both myself (seniorpastor@upcgl.org) and our administrator, Sue Schmidt (churchsec@upcgl.org). When possible, earlier is always better. Also, please include you desire care as clearly and directly as possible (i.e. a personal visit, phone call, or just a prayer in church).

Of course, calling or texting me directly is also encouraged and at times is the primary and best method of contacting me. In particular, when a need is of a highly personal or sensitive nature and pastoral confidence is essential, or when the need is urgent, unexpected or an emergency. In these instances a direct call or text is not only appropriate but highly encouraged. In fact, let me take this time to share with you my new phone number, **(224) 463-2171.** This number is for church related calls only. This phone line is precisely so that I can put a premium on being available for pastoral emergencies. Please use this number for me moving forward and be encouraged to use it, as that is what it is for!

Finally, I do ask in advance for grace and patience. I am committed to responding in a timely fashion and to be present when needed. There are occasions when despite my best efforts, I may take a day or two to respond. Please know this is never a reflection of your importance to me but just a reflection of my limits.

I am so grateful to serve as your minister and I give thanks to God for each one of you. It is food for my heart and soul to be privileged to offer pastoral support and care to all of you as God's people. I look forward to walking both to blessed and challenging times with you all as United Protestant Church together.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NEWS


Dear Church Family,

As we enter our time of preparing for Lent, I want to take some time to introduce our Lenten study for this year. One of the themes we will be returning to throughout the year is the Sermon on the Mount. This extended sermon by Jesus is important for our Christian lives. It helps us to know how to live in the world around us. The sermon shows us how to fulfill the two greatest commands: love God and love your neighbor. So, this year for Lent, we will be exploring this creed established by Jesus and how it impacts our lives.

Our study will be *40 Days Living the Jesus Creed* by Scot McKnight. It is a devotional reading based on his book, *The Jesus Creed: Loving God, Loving Others*. Joy Sharing for February

Tyler & **Brittany** serve an unreached people group in a remote area of **West Africa**. We support Translation by establishing a **Demonstration Fruit Tree Farm**.

Starting a Farm to meet people's physical needs is a great way to reach our community. Research shows that most people need repeated exposure to the good news before making a worldview change. We're starting by translating an **OT Summary** to explain why JC's sacrifice was necessary. Brittany does Comprehension Checking and we'll use our network of farmers for distribution.

We believe this combination of Word and Deed will transform lives!

So far in establishing the Demonstration Farm we:

- Bought 420 acres of land, drilled 3 water wells, training national employees
- Researching best practices like living fences, intercropping, and irrigation
- Imported from a neighboring country and transplanted grafted cashews
- Imported from the U.S. over a dozen varieties of grafted tropical fruit trees

Most people are undernourished so in addition to cashews as a cash crop, we're planting tropical fruit trees and perennial greens for increased **nutrition**.

Our Strategic Requests:

- Teammates: urgent need for agriculture teammates!
- **Trees**: good growth & protection from fire
- Translation: progress on OT Summary
- **Treasure**: as farm and family grow we need to raise \$2,000/month by end of 2023
