2 Corinthians 5.11-21 read this way:

The Ministry of Reconciliation

¹¹ Since, then, we know what it is to fear the Lord, we try to persuade others. What we are is plain to God, and I hope it is also plain to your conscience. ¹² We are not trying to commend ourselves to you again, but are giving you an opportunity to take pride in us, so that you can answer those who take pride in what is seen rather than in what is in the heart. ¹³ If we are "out of our mind," as some say, it is for God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you. ¹⁴ For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. ¹⁵ And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.

¹⁶ So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come:^[a] The old has gone, the new is here! ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: ¹⁹ that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. ²⁰ We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. ²¹ God made him who had no sin to be sin^[b] for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

The more I read these words of St. Paul to the church in Corinth the more I think that they could just as easily been written for us today. We live in a time, a moment in history even, when so much has divided us and kept us apart. Our politics divide us, the central ways in which we view truth divides us, a pandemic has kept us separate and so divided. So how will we as the church rise to be ambassadors for Christ who are about the ministry of reconciliation.

The leadership of the church and pastors have done what they can to be sure that we are able to continue to worship together and learn and grow together. Much of the work of the last year has been trying to continue to do ministry with new parameters and in new ways and in new spaces. This work has been good and vital but it is only a small portion of what is needed in the church today. What is needed today is for us to recapture the idea that ministry is the responsibility of every Christian. So to that end... what are you doing to build the Kingdom of God? Who are you reaching out to? Let me give you a few suggestions, and then, rather than just agree with this article, will you commit to action?

- Reach out to members at UPC that you know and haven't seen in a while. This could be almost anyone as we have been apart. But reach out!
- Talk to your neighbours. Maybe host a backyard cook out and invite them over. Listen to their story and pray for places to be able to talk about your faith and Jesus.
- Co-workers. This past year has been hard on our work in all places. How will you speak to the joy and hope you have in Christ to those with whom you work?
- Talk to your family members. Perhaps it is children, or grandchildren or parents. But reach out. Invite them to church and be willing to bring them! Or if you need a ride ask them to bring you!

The work of the Church is not for the church staff or leadership alone. The work of the Church is for all those who profess faith and follow Jesus. Let us all work together for the glory of God.

Dear Church Family,

I pray that as we enter into these summer months, you will find ways to continue to grow in your relationship with God and continue to develop into the disciples He calls us to be. Over the course of the summer, I encourage each of you to continue to listen to God so that you might know what next steps in faith He might have for you. Where are you on the journey of discipleship? If you remember early on, I walked through five general categories of our faith journey: Curious (John 1:35 – 46), Convinced (John 1:47 – 51), Confident (Mark 1:16 – 20), Consecrated (Luke 9:57 – 10:24), and Courageous (Matthew 28:18 – 20). Where might you fit in these five words? How might you continue to walk toward courageous faith, so that when we are before our savior, we have finished the race well?

If you know of any families who might be interested in participating, please share this opportunity with them. If you are willing to volunteer, please let me know as soon as possible.
