Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy June! This Sunday we will be celebrating our graduating seniors, acknowledging our Sunday School volunteers and commissioning our youth mission trip participants (who leave for Duluth in eleven days!). It will be a busy month!

Next month, we will be convening an **All-Church Retreat** on **July 15**th. I am praying that many (if not all) of you will participate. We are relying on our committee and commission members to be there, but even if you are not serving on one right now, be encouraged to come as well (and we will help you find one).

Why are we having an all-church retreat? Well, I am glad that you asked. I have four main intentions that I am planning and praying to accomplish at the all-church retreat.

First, when I arrived it was clear how tired and downtrodden everyone was because of the lingering effects of pandemic. However, while there has been a slow, gradual and clear procession beyond pandemic, I feel that we need to gather together and recommit to covenant fully to our life together as a congregation, post-pandemic.

Secondly, I have been here for eight months. In the last year there has been endless transition and a number of both adopted and proposed changes. It is an essential time to gather, pray and take stock of where we are and where God is calling us. Like any community or team, congregational flourishing requires taking time intentionally to clarify our vision, processes and roles in our life together.

Third, the very act of gathering together to review our hopes, roles and commitments is a act of prayer. In publicly gathering together, proclaiming who we are, who we hope to be and how we are going to get there is nothing less than an invitation to the Holy Spirit. We are naming our plans together, and inviting, DARING EVEN, the Holy Spirit to act through us to move us there. We will plan and talk, but we will also pray and worship; and it is my belief that God will meet us here and move amongst us.

We have also been blessed by a fourth providential goal on that day. As a part of our afternoon worship service, we will be celebrating Alisha Walker's Quinceanera. A daughter of this congregation will be celebrating her journey into young adulthood. There was a conversation about the suggested scheduling of the Quinceanera and the retreat on the same day; and I had a strong feeling that there was not a better way to gather for worship, on a day that we are clarifying who we are called by God to be, than to celebrate one of our young members into adulthood. Simply put, this is exactly why we are called to gather as United Protestant Church of Graysklake: to walk alongside one another in the light of God; encouraging one another to keep growing as disciples of Jesus.

Speaking of which, resurrection-minded discipleship will be our theme all summer. I pray that it will be a rich, relevant and life-giving time for us to listen to Jesus. I am praying that it may be a time of both rest and renewal for UPC as a congregation. I am grateful for this community and looking forward to the summer and next fall together.



STEWARDSHIP TESTIMONIAL

Presented during worship on May 14, 2023 by Dale Message

I would describe my life-long search and experience with organized religion as what does it mean to Love your neighbor and Who is your neighbor?

Somewhere between the late fall of 1994 or the start of 1995, I and my son Christopher started attending United Protestant Church and sometime later joined the church.

While my son Christopher attended Sunday School prior to the church service, I would sit in my vehicle and read the newspaper. I would assist in the classroom monthly as requested by the Christian Education Staff. Once Matthew was in first grade, I started to bring Chris and Matthew to Sunday School and Church Services.

I became aware I needed to attend Adult Education both as a proper example for my sons and to reengage with the study of the Bible (back when I was assigned to San Antonio, there was a small group of young adults and young adult education).

I recall when Adult Education would offer two topical studies to choose from during the Sunday education hour and sometimes it was difficult to choose between the two. Through the studies and topical videos series, I started to really understand what it meant to claim to be a Christian.

I committed to my son's completing confirmation, so we started to attend the 8:15 am service so Chris could attend confirmation along with the confirmation service requirements and this allowed Chris to make his Sunday football games.

My first opportunity to service United Protestant Church did not go well. When asked to serve, I was never told when the committee met and unfortunately, I had a Scouting commitment the same day of the week the committee met. Later, I was asked to serve on the Stewardship Committee and later accepted the chair of the committee. Next, I was asked to serve on the Budget & Finance Committee and later served as the chair.

When the message was made to the congregation the need for a delegate to United Methodist Annual Conference, I volunteered and was accepted. I attended that first annual conference in June; the theme was "Who is your neighbor?" At the conference I purchased my first study Bible and a devotion for daily reading of the Scripture along with commentary. At the conference, I also became more aware my neighbors are those I do not see every day and I realized the multi culture of the Northern Illinois Conference of the United Methodist Church. Each and every conference was a deeper understanding of who is my neighbor and how to be a disciple and to make others disciples of Jesus Christ.

During the Adult Education classes, I heard the testimonies of those that participated in the Disciple Bible Study. I did not hesitate when Disciple was offered by Steve Bulmer. Disciple Bible Study changed my Christian life. The deep study into the Scriptures, the daily readings and the discussion with the group was transformative. I was so into my daily devotional readings, that I continued them along with the necessary daily Disciple readings. Unfortunately, due to the scheduling of the second offering of Disciple, I could not participate, but participated in the third offering of Disciple. As the title of the course states, I learned and understood what it meant to be a disciple of Jesus. I truly wish someone would have influenced me as a young adult to participate in Disciple Bible Study. I know I would be a better husband and father had I experienced Disciple sooner.

I learned of opportunities to attend local courses offered by the UMC Annual Conference about radical hospitality, church leadership, organization of church leadership, discernment of the local area where the congregation is located and what are possible mission opportunities.

I participated in Adult mission trips to Seager Brown, LA; Red Bird Mission, KY; and Detroit, MI.

I also help with the PADS and Feed My Starving Children missions offered by the United Protestant Church.

I was asked and accepted to serve as a Member-at-Large on Administrative Council.

I was asked and accepted the Moderator/Lay Leader and thus the chair of the Staff Parish Committee.

During the pandemic, I connected with the United Church of Christ Zoom sessions both national and with the Illinois Conference. These sessions brought more fellowship with diverse individuals to build on what it means to be a disciple of Christ and to be a disciple to others I come in contact with.

I accepted the ask to chair the Administrative Council, my current leadership for United Protestant Church.

The Small Group I was associated with offered the necessity of gathering in a group to discuss and share together.

The Men's gathering on Wednesday mornings is important as the group membership includes other men attending other houses of worship and offers the diversity of being a man of Christ.

Through my participation in the education opportunities at United Protestant Church and the opportunities United Protestant Church has allowed me to participate in the classes and courses offered through the United Methodist Northern Illinois Annual Conference and the Illinois Conference of the United Church of Christ, I have learned what it means to be a disciple of Christ and who are my neighbors that Christ and God wants me to love as much as I love God and Christ.

June Joy Sharing — 2023 Adult Mission Trip to Mayfield, KY

We had a very rewarding trip this year to the tornado torn city of Mayfield, KY. We went there last year as well. They will need at least 5 years to recover from the December 2021 F4 tornado that ripped through their downtown. The funnel was 1 mile in diameter at that point. Our team of 10 spent much time at Rickie's house. Seven of his family members huddled in their tub with another 2 also occupying the bathroom during the storm. Two days later he and a friend replaced the roof on his garage so family members that lost their homes would have someplace dry to store their belongings. We had the privilege of replacing siding on the garage as well as installing soffit and facia to its roof. Rickie was at the house while we worked. He is a very resilient person with a tremendous attitude! He is disabled but has been raising his grandson for a number of years and is a pillar for his family in general. His house lost one porch corner post. His house was at the edge of the funnel as it passed through town. The next house lost its porch. The second house past his is now the last home as you go into the downtown. All others were destroyed. Various groups are building new homes but it will take years to bring Mayfield back to what it once was.

The featured OCC item for June is new balls and pumps. We hope to put some kind of ball in each of the 200 OCC boxes we pack.




