As we continue over the rest of this Lenten season, we will look at the rejection of Jesus, his turning toward Jerusalem, and the Passion of the King of Glory. In mid-April, we will be holding a book club styled discussion of the book *Where is God When It Hurts?* by Philip Yancey. I challenge you to reach out to friends, family, neighbors, or co-workers and see if they would be interested in examining these issues alongside us.

Finally, our semester of exploring suffering and trials will culminate in an examination of how to hear God's voice. During times of trial and difficulties, who's voice do we hear most often? When things are going well in our lives, do we continue to hear God's voice, or do we block it out because we seemingly don't need Him? Jesus often tells his listeners, "those who have ears, let them hear" and the prophets of the Old Testament calls their listeners to hear the Word of the Lord. In this study, I hope to explore how to have ears that hear and a heart ready to listen. I hope that you will join us later this Spring.

UPC PADS UPDATE

EMERGENCY SHELTER AND HOUSING FOR PADS CLIENTS:

The extremely cold weather in February meant a large increase in the number of guests seeking shelter with PADS Lake County. As of February 10, PADS was housing more than 240 guests in the three different motels/hotels. The majority continue to be in a single location where PADS has filled more than half of the hotel. The motel that was housing 25 guests now has about 40, and the remaining guests are still at the third location.

Local police departments and the sheriff's office continue to be very supportive and are helping whenever they find someone on the streets.



Please encourage anyone who is homeless to contact the PADS office 847-689-4357 or to go there in person (See photo of 1800 Grand Avenue PADS.) 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday thru Friday or to call their local police department for emergency shelter during other hours and weekends.

UPC PADS IN ACTION: NOW PROVIDING 30 INDIVIDUAL HOT MEALS EACH THURSDAY:

PREPARING & DELIVERING MEALS: Margaret Hilliard and our UPC PADS Kitchen Crew cooked and delivered dinners for 25 guests their first week, but that number has now risen to 30 guests needing meals in the motel where the meals are delivered. The other 10 guests at that location are able to furnish their own dinners.

DONATIONS FOR DINNERS: We are very appreciative of the donations that have started to arrive at UPC to help pay for the food to make the dinners for the guests. If you're willing and able to contribute any amount, please send a check payable to UPC with "PADS dinners" or "PADS food" written in the memo section. These donations are being used to pay directly for the food purchased to make the dinners.

OTHER DONATIONS are not being collected at UPC, but arrangements can be made for Rose Pech to meet you at the church if you have items that need to be delivered to the main office in Waukegan, and you aren't able to deliver them yourself. (See Rose's contact info below.)

PADS LAKE COUNTY'S GREATEST NEEDS:

Cleaning supplies (Clorox wipes, Lysol spray, etc.)

Paper products (Toilet paper, paper towels, sturdy paper plates & bowls)

Nonperishable food items in packages or pop-top cans, especially high-protein foods

Toiletries and stick deodorant

The office has enough hand sanitizer at this point, and clothing donations must be first checked out with Nicole Harris.
