I invite you to join us in our season of Lent. Our Adult class is working through 40 Days Living the Jesus Creed by Scot McKnight, reflecting on how we can live our daily lives in line with loving God and loving our neighbor. These are the two greatest commandments. The call of the Christian life in so many ways can be boiled down to these two callings. Both are accomplished by the power of the Holy Spirit changing our hearts from just loving ourselves to opening them to the heart of God and to the needs of our neighbor. I still have books available, and our weekly discussions are on Sunday mornings in the Parlor space. Join us throughout this Lenten season as we seek to live out our calling as Christ's disciples.

There are a couple upcoming events that I would like to make you aware of so that you can put them on your calendar and join us as we come to Easter and the celebration of our risen Christ. Both are for the day before Easter, Saturday, April 8th, 2023.

Our **Annual Easter Egg Hunt** will be held on **April 8**th **at 2:00 p.m.** on the Front Lawn, weather permitting. Join us and invite any kids you know to hunt for Easter Eggs, hear the Easter story, and enjoy some treats. Be watching for more information on this to come soon!

We are also holding an **Easter Vigil** on **Saturday**, **April** 8th **at** 6:30 **p.m**. This is a wonderful opportunity to walk through the story of the Bible and how God from the very beginning of creation is rescuing His people and by His grace reaching out to them. Each of the stories will be told in a variety of ways by different groups in the church, so come join in the fun as we reflect upon the works of God throughout history and await the resurrection of Christ.

Coming soon to Adult Education is Discipleship and the *Didache*. The *Didache*, which means "teaching" in its original Greek language, is a Christian worship and discipleship manual that arose in parallel to the Gospel of Matthew. As UPC dwells in the Gospel of Matthew this lectionary season we will explore the *Didache* as a piece of Christian history and as a guide to our own Christian discipleship.



The Damascus Project provides training and education for lay leaders and courses for those seeking authorized ministry in the UCC. Rev. Perdew continues in her role as affiliate professor of Christian history at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary.
