What Will Be Your Witness

We all know the term, 'evangelism'. But what does it mean? To some of us it may have a negative connotation of taking advantage of someone or being rude or forcing our beliefs upon someone else. But evangelism is not these things. What is evangelism? Evangelism comes from the Greek word, 'euangelion', which very simply means 'good news'. Evangelism then is simply telling 'good news'. But what is the good news we have to tell? We tell the good new of Jesus Christ. But I am increasingly convinced of this reality. That what we tell in the good news of Jesus Christ cannot be, only, the historic reality of Jesus who was born and died and was raised again. We cannot tell only, the theological truths about Jesus; that He was born of the Virgin, is fully God and fully man. No, in order for us to tell the good news of Jesus Christ, we have to not only have had a real experience with the risen Christ ourselves, but we must also have an ongoing relationship with Jesus.

For far too many of us, our relationship with Jesus is old. It is more than old, it was a once was. We knew Jesus, we believed, but we ended things there. It was almost as if we had a wedding, but we don't have a marriage. We can look back in the picture album in our mind and point to the memories of a glorious day in which we came to faith. Or perhaps our relationship is relegated to the slide show of vacations of yesteryear. We can remember the good times of where we went and what we experienced with Christ, but we have no real vibrancy and depth of an ongoing relationship with Jesus.

I am convinced that the main reason that our evangelism is so weak is because our discipleship is so weak. So let me suggest three steps to helping you grow in your discipleship no matter where you are currently:

- Worship with the Church. There is no substitute for being together with other Christians in the local church worshipping and being encouraged by the Holy Spirit and each other.
- God's Word. Read the Bible at home and study the Scriptures with others through education opportunities at church.
- Pray. Daily be in the presence of God be praying, talking and listening to God throughout your day.

So, during the game portion of the practice, he was on the same team as one of his friends from school. Throughout the game, we had to remind him that he needed to pay attention to the game and not just talk with his friend.
