The Mercy of God

Recently in worship we looked at the healing of Bartimaeus found in Mark 10. In that story, Bartimaeus was crying out to Jesus, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" He was calling out so loudly and so persistently that it annoyed the people and many told him to be quiet. Jesus hears him and calls out for him and as we might remember or imagine, Jesus heals him.

Bartimaeus was clearly sober minded when it came to his condition. He knew that what he wanted was healing, but he knew that in order for him to be healed, he needed mercy. Now our society doesn't talk that much about mercy. What is mercy? How might we define it?

compassion or forgiveness shown toward someone whom it is within one's power to punish or harm

This is the definition given with a Google search and I think it is a good one. In other words, we might say mercy is when we don't get what we do deserve. Bartimaeus knew, that not only was he unworthy to demand healing, but that he also didn't want what he knew he did deserve.

Peter writes this in 1 Peter:

"But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy." 1 Peter 2.9-10

I believe (and I preach to myself more than to anyone) that we all need to think deeply upon the mercy God has given us. Rightly contemplating the mercy we have received should remind us: 1. Of our need for a Saviour but also 2. The greatness of the love that our Saviour has for us.

Praise be to God that in the greatness of His love He had not given us the punishment we deserve.

It is hard to believe that it is already November. Time goes by so quickly. This month, I would like to provide you with a brief update on our upcoming educational ministries.

Our Adult studies will continue through the month of November. On Sunday mornings, we are exploring Christian Community and on Tuesday evenings, on Zoom, we are working through the book of James. This year, we will be doing something a little different. First, our Advent study will be held immediately following the 10:00 AM worship service. We encourage people of all ages to join us as we walk through the book *SENT: Delivering the Gift of Hope at Christmas*. Watch for more details related to our joint Advent Study. I really look forward to this opportunity to have faith conversations all together as a church.

Our Children's Ministry continues to seek answers to the BIG question "Who Does God Say That I Am?". Through various Bible stories students discover who they are created to be and who they are in Christ. This is a wonderful opportunity to help facilitate conversations seeking to help our kids work through questions of identity and belonging. Each week, I love hearing my children describe their Sunday School lesson. What an opportunity to help our kids learn more about who God is and who they are.

On the family front, the time I have dreaded has finally arrived. Both of our kids are in a dual language program at school. William's teacher teaches 90% of his day in Spanish and 10% English. Anabelle has English instruction in the morning followed by teaching in Spanish in the afternoon. So, from the day Anabelle started the program, I have been waiting for the day they both decide to just talk to each other in Spanish at the table where they know I have no idea what they are saying. Last night, that day arrived. It is great to hear them utilizing (at least hopefully decently, because I have no idea) what they are learning about in school.

I hope that you all are doing well, and I look forward to continuing to grow in our relationship with God together. How wonderful it is to do this work in community.
