Thank you for reading, and I hope to see you at our Advent events in December.

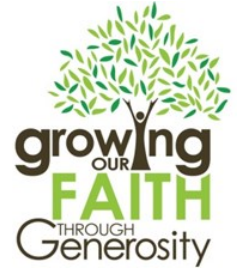

STEWARDSHIP NEWS



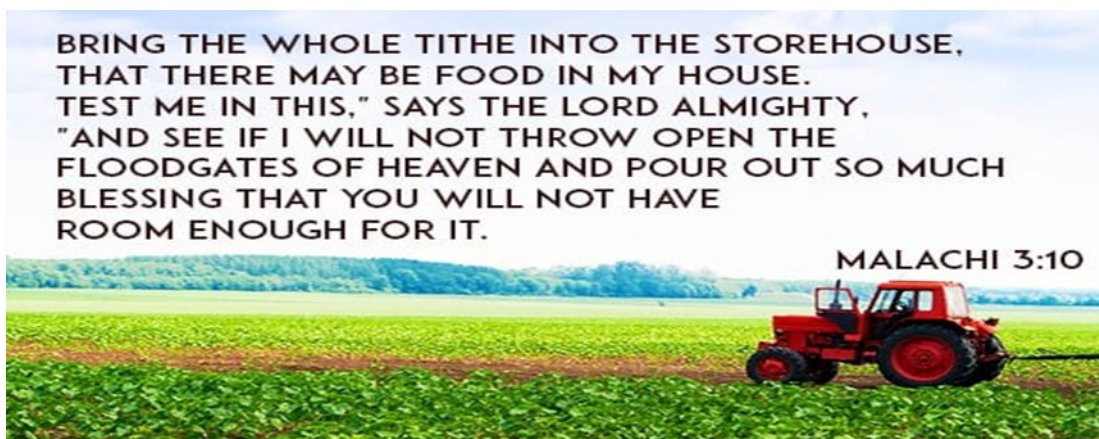
Dear Friends,

We have reaped the first pledges of our 2025 pledge campaign, and we have been promised approximately \$137,000 thus far. Compared to the first week of last year's pledge receipts, we are \$7,000 ahead. This is promising, and we heartily thank those of you who have made your pledge to support the United Protestant Church, its staff, ministries, programs, and Christian mission to make disciples for the transformation of the world. However, this first pass falls far short of our final 2024 budget. I would be remiss if I did not state this.

Don't see cards for a store you shop at? Ask the sales person to request a special order. Many more stores are available than just what we keep in stock. Special orders are usually available in two weeks and do not cost extra. Want those cards even faster? Ask Lynn about using the app on your phone and getting the cards immediately.

Did you know that this year the profits from the UPC Shopper will be going to help pay the shipping costs for our Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes? Cards of each of these types are now being accepted for 2025, and packets of Christmas cards are on the Mission table with suggested messages for signing them. Inmates who stay connected to family and friends are more successful upon their release.

GLEANNING

As gleaning season comes to a close, we thank the 11 volunteers who went into the fields and orchards 11 times on behalf of UPC and saved 85 pounds of apples, 264 pounds of potatoes, and 3,780 pounds of corn from going to waste. This food was provided to the Northern Illinois Food Bank that helps feed our hungry neighbors. We also thank Vernon Stade of Stade's Farm & Market in McHenry for his kind generosity in donating all of this food. This year we were also able to encourage other volunteers in the area to glean with us, and through their efforts 530 pounds of potatoes, 3,094 pounds of apples, and 9,307 pounds of corn were also donated to various area food pantries and the Food Bank. Our thanks also to Anthony DeMoon of Heinz Orchard in Green Oaks for much of the apples.

- **Walmart gift card purchases made at UPC** allow you to give to two missions at once if you donate the cards to UPC PADS because a percentage of the price goes to Operation Christmas Child, and we use the cards to buy and deliver food, clothing, and other items needed by PADS clients.
- Diapers are needed in sizes 1 through 5. PADS is accepting any brand that is donated. Bring them to UPC to be delivered where they are needed.
