- 2. It causes us to pay attention to ways in which God is currently working or will work in the future. It gives us a fresh view to be on the look out for God in our current moments and in in our futures.
- 3. It opens God's story in your story to others that they might experience the goodness of our God. Far too many people don't know that God is real and that God is alive. They think of some dead and wooden religious doctrine or an angry God when they think upon Him. Tell your story so that they might know the very real presence of God with them.

These are three good reasons to share your story of what God has done and is doing in you! Go tell of His marvelous works! Go tell of His faithfulness in the midst of our unfaithfulness. Shout to the world of the greatness of the story of God as He reveals Himself to us.
