

STEWARDSHIP NEWS





We are in the middle of our 2025 Stewardship Campaign, and as Stewardship Chairperson, I have spent the last 6 months praying, reading, and attempting to discern how I might emphasize the meaning of this spiritual work to achieve the greatest understanding. God answered my prayer through my prayer group when one of our members introduced us to the book 7 Men and the Secret of Their Greatness by Eric Metaxas where we read about seven extraordinary Christian men, some with the remarkable gift of stewardship.

Meet Eric Liddell, or do you already know him? Eric was the Christian Missionary to China featured in the movie *Chariots of Fire*, who won a gold medal for the 400-meter race in 1924 for Great Britain, being of Scottish descent. You see, Jesus, in His wisdom, bestowed the gifts of running (very fast), public speaking (evangelism/teaching), faith and mercy upon Eric, and he found a way to use all his time and gifts serving Jesus in all circumstances such as in sickness and in health and when it was easy or tough.

After winning gold, Eric became a local hero. However, hanging around and reveling in his fame was not his call. He answered God's call to return to war-torn China and spread the gospel to people who had not been previously blessed with the Good News. In China, he taught, preached, did manual labor, prayed, and persistently encouraged others until dying at the age of 43 in a Japanese internment camp. Near the end, he was separated from his family (wife, three children), extremely sick (brain tumor) and living in sparse and then foul living conditions; however, every day he smiled, praised the Lord, and did everything he could to ease others' suffering.

From Eric, I learned to persevere in doing God's assigned work no matter how difficult it may be. I discovered that it is God's will that we care for one another even when we are sick and tired or frankly distracted from His Truth. Finally, I find it inspiring that Eric lived as though "God has great plans for each of us. Those plans may include giving up something we value highly. But those who give up what we may most desire-if God has demanded it-the Lord will truly honor." (7 Men, pg. 87, by E. Metaxas)

TOY SHARING FOR OCTOBER

Our Joy Sharing opportunity for October is Feed My Starving Children, an organization quite familiar to many of us. Something you may not be as familiar with is the fact that all the food ingredients are purchased by FMSC with donated funds. The packaged food is then donated to as many as 112 countries around the world, and incredibly, the food is given to partner organizations in those countries, and those partner organizations pay for the shipping of the food, creating accountability.

Listed below are some impressive statistics to share with you. Volunteers from UPC have made a huge impact at FMSC. The current 2024 year-to-date statistics are:

- Number of volunteer hours = 999
- Meals packed = 242,554
- Kids fed for a year = 749

And since tracking of UPC's volunteering began in 2012, the totals are incredible!

- Total number of meals packed by UPC = 2,023,438 (that's right ... over 2 million!)
- Total number of kids fed for a year = 5,840!

So please realize that every time you commit to volunteering at FMSC with our church on the first Tuesday of the month, or with those who volunteer weekly on Wednesdays and Fridays, you are making a profound difference in someone's life! - Current client numbers: As of September 27, 2024, 460 people who are experiencing a
 housing crisis were housed in motels in Lake County. This number included 72 families with
 177 children under the age of 18.

Use their online signup genius for an open date, or call 847-689-4357 to let them know you'd like to deliver lunches to the office. Lunch and dinner items as well as cleaning supplies are needed daily and can be donated here at UPC, delivered to 1st Presbyterian Church in Libertyville on Wednesdays from 4 to 6 PM, or purchased at this Amazon link and delivered directly to 1st Presbyterian Church.
