# **Stewardship**

Outside of church these days we don't much hear about stewardship. What is stewardship anyway? And what specifically do we mean in the Christian context when we say or hear the word? A steward is simply a person who has something entrusted to them for them to manage in a way that is honoring. God has granted us many good things in our lives which we should manage in a wise and God-honoring way. God has given us the resources of time, and talents, and skills, and goods through which we can honor Him. Because God is the giver of all good gifts, when we give back to God, we are giving nothing else than a portion of what He has first entrusted to us. In this way, we aren't giving God part of what we have, but rather, we are giving back to Him a portion of what is already His.

When we understand rightly that all that we have is God's, it then frees us to see that what we give is what we are able to give freely, because the impetus of giving isn't in fulfilling a duty or merely to give out of guilt, but it is to give out of a deep sense of gratitude. Thankfulness always precedes giving. This fall we will hear from various people in our church engaged in ministry that God has entrusted to us to steward. We will hear about ways in which we are called to steward our resources, to care for those in our community who are in need, how we care for the Christian educational needs of people who come into UPC, we will hear about ways in which we care for the proclamation of the Gospel, and ways in which we care for our physical building. God has indeed richly blessed us, but He has not blessed us so that we may simply delight in the good He has given us (although when we do this we call it thankfulness), but we have been blessed to be a blessing to others. May we use this Fall time of harvest to contemplate how God is calling each of us to be a steward of what He has entrusted to us.
