"Cracked Cisterns Can Hold No Water"

When my wife and I lived in Seymour, Indiana, we decided to place in our backyard a garden plot. Our neighbors were the inspiration of our garden I would say. They had always had this great garden, well-maintained, producing a large selection of vegetables for eating as well as canning.

I will have to say, however, our efforts failed in comparison to theirs. Ours became overgrown with weeds. We did have a large amount of pumpkins and zucchini. Do you know how many different ways one can make zucchini? These items, however, overran our weed-infested garden with long lengthy vines.

Now you might suggest we were not the best caretakers of our garden, and you would not get an argument from me or my wife. It was embarrassing to live next door to the "master gardener."

The reason I share this story with you is because our neighbors, once they canned the vegetables, they placed them in a "cistern"—One that you could walk underground and place your produce for safe keeping!

But here is the thing about cisterns—Sometimes they crack and can hold no water. Case in point, our scripture reading talks about the problem with the "cracked" cisterns of God's people in Jeremiah. The brokenness came because of a need for more spiritual depth among the people.

"My people have committed a compound sin: they've walked out on me, the fountain Of fresh flowing waters, and then dug cisterns—

cisterns that leak, cisterns that are no better than sieves. (Message Translation)

The good news for us is that Jesus explains how you and I can start mending our brokenness by practicing what God desires: "When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers and sisters or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. ¹³ But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. ¹⁴ And you will be blessed because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous." (Luke 14:12b-14)

Dear Church Family,

I am so very excited about our upcoming ministry year. This September, we have some great things to offer you as you seek to grow in your faith.

All our discipleship ministries begin on September 11th. Children's Ministry and Adult Ministry both begin Sunday, September 11th at 9:00 AM. Children will be beginning the year by exploring Creation during the month of September, and at the end of the month for our Unity Sunday, they will learn about stewardship. Adults will begin the year working through Tim Keller's *The Prodigal God*, exploring the parable of the prodigal son(s). I am very excited for both of these opportunities.

Confirmation also begins September 11th. Confirmation will continue to be held from 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM. I am looking forward to walking through The Heidelberg Catechism with our students, exploring the foundations of our faith, and examining how we put them into practice in our lives.

There are two other fantastic opportunities that will be coming to our church this year.

The first is we will be offering Children's Church during the Sunday Morning service. This will be held in the preschool room (#203) during the sermon portion of the service. Children will be dismissed for Children's Church right before the sermon, and on Sundays where there is communion, the children will return to their parents at that time, so that they can participate in the life of the church. On noncommunion Sundays, children will stay in Children's Church through the end of the service. We are planning on this beginning in September. A reminder will be sent out to families the week before the service as a reminder.

The Christian Education Commission and I are really excited about our second additional opportunity. I cannot provide the full details at this point but be watching for an announcement and information no later than Sunday, September 18th. Simply put, soon you will be able to have access to an incredible wealth of discipleship materials in your home. There will be resources for all ages, almost any topic, or Bible study you would want to do. My family has really enjoyed this resource, and we are very excited to bring it to you in a couple of weeks!

On the family front recently, we had some great excitement in our home. William lost two teeth in the same day. The first fell out in a neighbor's pool. Thankfully, we were able to recover this tooth to provide to the tooth fairy. The second tooth fell out while he was brushing his teeth. Unfortunately, we were unable to recover this one as it went down the drain. So, William was very concerned that since he only had one tooth, the tooth fairy would not know he lost both teeth, so we had to write a little note to the tooth fairy. If you want to hear more about it, ask him, he loves telling the story.
