It is one of the great privileges of being a pastor to see and share the good news of a congregation's generosity. I hope I say "thank you" half as generously as you give.



#### CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NEWS

Dear Church Family,

I am so excited for the beginning of our new ministry year. We have some wonderful opportunities planned throughout our educational ministries. Last month, I told you about our first Adult class, S.H.A.P.E., where we will be exploring our Kingdom Purpose and Divine Design. I would highly recommend that you participate in this class, Sundays at 9:00 AM or Tuesdays at 7:00 PM on Zoom, so that you might begin to feel equipped for the service that God called you to (Ephesians 2:10). This month, I want to take some time to tell you about what the children in our Children's Ministry will be exploring over the course of the year.

This year, our 9:00 Children's Sunday School will be moving to a curriculum called, *Living the Word*. This is a curriculum that utilizes the narrative lectionary, which tells the story of Scripture from Creation to the Early Church. One of the goals of this switch is to continue our process of connecting our educational ministries with all that we do in our Sunday morning worship. Our kids at 9:00 on Sundays will be examining the same or similar passages of Scripture as we will during the 10:00 worship service. I am really excited about the opportunities that this can provide for our families. One hope that I have is that we can help build into our children a sense of value and belonging, where they are able to contribute and understand our Worship service in greater ways. I also hope that they will be able to take the lessons home with them and have valuable faith conversations with their parents about what we did in Sunday morning worship. Helping make our church into a place where kids can experience true belonging, value, and service is such an important part of their faith formation. We pray that we will create an environment where our kids' faith sticks.

On the family front, the family has returned to school. Anabelle began 5<sup>th</sup> grade this year, and William is in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. This means they are once again at the same school and riding the same bus, which makes afternoon bus pick-up a little easier. At the beginning of the summer, Anabelle made a goal to visit all the playgrounds listed on the Mundelein Parks Department website. She did well, though there are a few we still need to visit. On the last day of the summer, I took the kids to three different playgrounds. They mostly enjoyed their time at the parks, but what was probably the favorite part of these playgrounds? Was it the monkey bars? Was it the slides or maybe jungle gyms? No, by far one of the favorite parts of the playgrounds we visited were the bushes that they turned into houses. I am glad that they can still use their imaginations to play with almost anything.

Thank you for taking the time to read. I hope that you will join us beginning September 8<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 AM for our educational ministries. I am really excited for the various programs that we will be offering this coming ministry year.

**September is Hunger Action Month.** 

HUNGER Many people think hunger is only found in other areas – not where we live. This is not true. In a report published in 2022, more than 44 million people (including 1 in every 5 children) in America faced hunger. In Lake County Illinois, more than 70,000 people were food insecure. That's 9.9% of the population. YOU can do something about this problem.

Our church works against hunger and other social issues in many Taking a stand against hunger. ways. Here are just a few of the missions we support that work against hunger as well as suggestions on how you can help.

- 1. The **Northern Illinois Food Bank** which supplies food to area food pantries is located at 13950 Business Center Drive in Lake Forest. Consider volunteering there as an individual, family or group of friends or co-workers. Most of the time, the volunteers spend their time inspecting, sorting and packaging food for those in need locally. There are tasks available for all skill levels. Ages 8 and up are welcome with adult supervision. Want to know more? Go to www.solvehungetoday.org or ask some of the members who already volunteer, such as Jack Powell, Linda Rambo, or Cinda Bartz.
- 2. **Avon Community Food Pantry** which supplies food to local residents in need is located at 433 E. Washington Street in Round Lake Park. They run a small food pantry that is always looking for donations and/or volunteers. If you have questions about what is required of the volunteers, please contact a member of Circle 2 as they have volunteered there before.
- 3. **Feed My Starving Children** located at 742 E. Park Avenue in Libertyville provides meals to children around the world who are not just hungry, they are starving. Around 6,200 children die each day due to undernourishment related causes. Volunteers at FMSC pack nutritious meals to help feed these needy children. There are volunteer jobs for everyone aged 5 and over with adult supervision. Want to know more? Go to www.FMSC.org or talk to a member of the Mission Committee or various other UPC members who have volunteered.
- 4. **PADS** is a Lake County organization that is always in need of food to support those being housed in local facilities who cannot afford to feed themselves and their families. Please consider picking up some extra items at the grocery store the next time you are shopping. All items must be shelf-stable. It doesn't have to be a lot. Every donation is appreciated. Contact Rose Pech, Rick Burg or Cinda Bartz if you have questions.
- 5. **Lake County Haven** is a social-service agency dedicated to meeting the needs of homeless women and children and helping them get back on their feet. They can use grocery items or even home cooked meals to help sustain them. Groceries can be left in the bin in the narthex. If you would like to provide a home cooked meal, contact the Mission Committee for more info.
- 6. Join other UPC members in going to area farms and orchards and picking corn or apples or other produce to donate to Northern Illinois Food Bank or Avon Food Pantry. Learn more from Dave Bartz, Dale Message or Cinda Bartz.
- 7. Consider wearing the color **orange** on Hunger Awareness Day which is September 10. If someone comments on the color choice, explain just how big an issue hunger is in the world
- 8. Become an Advocate Learn about essential anti-hunger policies and how to contact your elected representatives.

No matter what action you choose to take, every action counts in the fight against hunger.

INK180 is also working to stop human trafficking and aid those who are rescued.

We have all heard of gang tattoos, but did you know that human traffickers often tattoo their victims to identify them as their personal property? How awful would it be to go through life with that kind of permanent reminder on your body?

Chris Baker provides his time, supplies and artwork, entirely free of charge to the victims. INK180 is entirely funded by donations; no charge is ever asked of the people receiving Chris' ministry. He cannot operate any other way; beautiful second chances are totally free, already paid in full by the One who paid it all. They were for Chris, they are for us, so they must also be for those who have already suffered so much.


