If you currently have or have had children attend SGS, you know that our school has been providing lunches for the guests of the PADS for many years. This was my first introduction to PADS. I have always been very involved volunteering in my children's schools, sports teams and church, but as they've gotten older I've found myself looking for different ways to give back. I first started volunteering at PADS about 6 years ago on the kitchen cleanup shift. I figured as a wife and mom I can clean any kitchen!
