

Dear Church Family,

After a long wait, our ministry year is finally beginning. This month, our Children's Ministry, Adult Ministry, Confirmation, and Youth Ministry begin offering spiritual education opportunities. This month, I am going to provide a brief update on what will be offered this Fall. We have spent a lot of time thinking through how all of these opportunities will work, and even with that planning, we understand that all these plans are held loosely. We hope that you all find time to participate in one or multiple opportunities.

This year in Children's Ministry, we will provide packets with supplies for a lesson and an activity to go alongside prerecorded video lessons starting twice per month. Our desire is to also do a Unity Sunday like event once per month via Zoom, to provide an opportunity to for kids to connect with each other as well as with the facilitators. We hope that this will provide families with sufficient flexibility to allow as many as possible to continue engaging in our Children's Ministry.

Confirmation will be meeting on Sunday evenings at 5 pm. They will begin on Zoom. This year we will be working through the Heidelberg Catechism in our Confirmation class to explore the basics of the faith in more depth. If you are interested in getting a taste of what our confirmands will be learning, I encourage you to watch Pastor Ryan's teachings through the Heidelberg Catechism. They can be found on the church <u>YouTube channel</u> and our <u>website</u>.

Adult Education is offering two classes to begin our year. The first is a class taught by Pastor Ryan and I working through *Spiritual Disciplines for the Christian Life* by Donald Whitney. This will be a series of video lessons followed by opportunities for discussion, in-person on Sundays and on Zoom Wednesday evening. This class will last seven weeks and provide an exploration of the spiritual disciplines that help us grow our faith. It is built off of our cancelled summer retreat. The second opportunity is a book club style discussion of the book *Generous Justice* by Tim Keller. It explores issues related to social justice and explores ideas related to showing love to our neighbors. For this study, people will read the book *Generous Justice* and we will then hold a discussion on the book at the beginning of November. Emily Aubrey will facilitate this discussion.

Now is a perfect time to jump into any of our ministries. I hope that you will look to participating in our ministry offerings this year. Those who have not had the opportunity to participate in our Adult Ministry opportunities, I encourage you to join in this year. MAJOR CHANGES IN WCF:

WCF is facing many changes which have been shared with circle members by their chairperson and with Task Force members by Rose Pech. Some of these require changes in the WCF Constitution and/or By Laws. WCF members should expect to receive an email, or a letter if they don't use email, sometime soon if they haven't already. The suggestions for revisions will be noted in each attached document, and each member is asked to reply promptly to the email, voting for or against the recommended changes.

The WCF Board is proposing to no longer have dues or a budget, but we hope to have individual members contribute enough that we continue the support that we've been giving to Tyler and Brittany. Individual circles will decide on any other specific ministries/missions they wish to support.

Another major change is the dissolution of Circle 6. Most members of Circle 6 are no longer physically able to participate in the monthly lunch meetings. Many will continue to be honorary WCF members, just as members of other circles have done in the past.

An additional change will be the dissolution of the Task Force with its members also being able to be honorary members of WCF. The purpose of the task force has been to provide an opportunity for members who couldn't meet monthly to still participate in the service & fundraising activities of WCF. This is no longer necessary since WCF is not doing fundraising, and the service opportunities are available through other avenues.

Our WCF Directory is being updated for 2021, members are asked to share any changes in their contact information with their circle chairperson or with Sue Schmidt who is making the revisions for us.

UPC PADS UPDATE

The most recent info from PADS Lake County staff as of mid-September reported 150 guests still housed in 3 hotels and supported with laundry supplies and food while they continued to receive other PADS services.

PADS will not be operating any rotating sites this year. The decision has also been made that it would be the safest for our guests and volunteers to start the season without a fixed site option. <u>PADS will be offering</u> <u>emergency shelter through hotel stays that can be accessed at any time</u>. If we find that the need for emergency shelter is too great, we do have the option to open a small fixed site as a plan B.

Emergency services will have access to an on-call number that can be called at any time to help a client access shelter until they can connect with our main office and be added into one of our three main hotels. Once the final plan is operationalized, site leaders will receive an email with information so they can all connect someone to emergency shelter or feel confident if someone comes to a site this fall. A sign on the outside doors of UPC will let people know that our site is closed for the season and will direct them to the Grayslake Police Department so they can be assisted

The organization delivering meals on weekdays has committed to doing this through December. PADS will have an online signup for this soon. How to Help PADS Lake County Clients

Food items that can be donated for PADS staff to pack into boxes for clients include the following:

(MOST NEEDED are Canned pop-top items and individual snack and breakfast items)

- Microwavable meals in pop-top cans (chili, chef Boyardee, Dinty Moore meals, Chunky soup,
- Ravioli, Spaghetti and Meatballs)
- Microwavable soups in containers or pop-top cans
- Small jars of peanut butter and/or jelly
- Mac 'n Cheese cups
- Ramon cups
- Beef Jerky, Slim Jim, Meat Sticks. Spam Packets, Tuna Packets
- Breakfast Cereal bars or granola bars, small sized boxes of cereal, Pop Tarts
- Fruit cups, applesauce cups or Pudding cups
- Boxes of microwavable Oatmeal packets
- Crackers in boxes with separate packs
- Granola bars
- Pop tarts
- Small bags of chiips or cookies

\$10 McDonald gift cards are also helpful because clients can use these to get a special treat once a week.

If you wish to make up boxes that are ready for PADS staff to give to the clients, each box would ideally include the following items:

- 1 jar Peanut butter
- Three packs of crackers
- 5 granola bars
- 3-4 canned goods (chili, chef Boyardee, Dinty Moore meals, Chunky soups)
- 2 poptarts
- 2 packs oatmeal
- 2 cups applesauce/fruit cups
- 4-5 small bags chips or one large bag

This would be the "ideal" box and can be modified if need be. This is what we have been providing based on what we are seeing come in with donations.

What else you can do to help:

--Create "COVID Kits" - kits to be distributed with 2 reusable or several disposable masks, hand

sanitizer, a few pairs of hygiene gloves

--Collect cleaning supplies for PADS- we are distributing cleaning supplies to those in our hotels and are going through what little we are able to order very quickly. Biggest needs: disinfecting wipes, disinfecting sprays, paper towels, bleach etc. (Lysol spray, especially)

--Donating PPE – we are still using cloth masks and handing them out to our clients who need them!

--If you or someone you know are crafty, we are always accepting cloth masks and other donations of PPE.

Donations can be dropped off at PADS, 1800 Grand Avenue in Waukegan on Monday – Friday, between 8am and 4pm. You will not need to enter the building. Staff members can "grab and go" from your car. Just pull up & ring the bell at the door. Someone will come to get the donations from you.
