Class Notes December 2017/January 2018



Dear Members and Friends.

This fall I have been facilitating an adult education class entitled *The Christian Atheist*. The author, Senior Pastor Craig Groeschel of LifeChurch.tv, suggests to us that "believing in God" is a far cry from being a fully devoted follower of His. You see, we have to KNOW Him to truly follow Him. How can we KNOW Him? We can worship Him, read His Word, join with other believers in small group study like our Adult Education Sunday offerings, Disciple, Advent and Lenten studies, pray to Him, read spiritual literature by saints and other inspired leaders of the church, experience a weekly Sabbath, etc.

Because we are now in the Christmas season, I would like to highlight one of the major points we have discussed in class from *The Christian Atheist* on spending. WHEN YOU BELIEVE IN GOD BUT TRUST MORE IN MONEY... Ouch.... The #1 competitor for our hearts is MONEY. We tend to trust in money to provide us with happiness and security. If you would like a biblical perspective on this, turn to Matthew 19:21-22 and Luke 19:8. These are the familiar stories of the rich young ruler who Christ Himself tells to sell everything to follow HIM yet he goes away sad, and the story of Zacchaeus, the tax collector, who after meeting Jesus willingly (no request from Christ) gives away half (that's 50%) and promises to repay four times anyone he may have cheated.

We likely favor one of these men. At this holiest of times when we once again welcome the Christ into our lives, why not recommit to genuinely LOVING Him. Craig suggests that in falling in love with Jesus two things will happen.

You will become strangely CONTENT. (See **1Timothy 6:17**.)

You will become irrationally GENEROUS. (Sounds like Zacchaeus to me.)

I am not the person to tell you how to spend your money. That is something Jesus makes clear, and we each need to work out with Him. What I do know is that there is a lot of starvation, devastation, illness and loneliness around this globe that our Father created, and I can do something about it by following the Son.

May you be a blessing to your family, your community and the world this Christmas and throughout 2018.

Proposed change to UPC's By-Laws

At the November 20 Administrative Council meeting the Nominations Committee brought forward a proposed change to our current By-Laws to allow more flexibility in filling vacancies on committees and commissions. The proposed change was approved by Council vote; The congregation will need to approve this change at our Annual Meeting on January 28, 2018:

Current Wording:

Article VI – Commissions; Section 2. Each commission shall consist of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and the Chairpersons of each committee responsible to the respective commission. Commission Chairpersons shall not serve as a chairperson of any committee within his/her commission.

Proposed Wording:

Article VI – Commissions; Section 2. Each commission shall consist of the Chair-person, Vice-Chairperson and the Chairpersons of each committee responsible to the respective commission. *The chair of budget and finance committee shall not also serve as Operations commission chair.*

This change will allow us greater flexibility in filling leadership positions while maintaining proper checks and balances (conflict of interest) within our financial control areas.

UPC PADS UPDATE

CELEBRATING 30 YEARS OF SERVICE!!!

PADS Lake County, Inc. began as a PADS church shelter site program. The first church opened its doors on Christmas Eve, December 24,1987, welcoming those experiencing homelessness in Lake County. Since that time what started as one program (Public Action to Deliver Shelter) designed to provide emergency shelter and food to those who were experiencing homelessness has developed into an organization which does so much more. PADS now stands for Providing Advocacy, Dignity and Shelter and consists of many programs designed to help prevent homelessness, assist those who are experiencing homeless to



get the help they need to overcome the issue(s) that are causing their homelessness, & to help them get into permanent housing. These programs include the Day Resource Center, Family Shelter, Outreach, Prevention & Diversion, Housing First, and Supportive Housing in addition to the continued Emergency Overnight Shelter system, which includes our UPC PADS Site for our 27th season.


